IOWA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

This voting record covers only recorded votes of the Iowa Senate and Iowa House that are of interest to labor. Thus, unfortunately, not all of our priorities are in the record, and we must use other means to determine legislators' positions on those issues until such time as there is an official vote. This record does, however, serve as a tool to help Iowa trade unionists access whether or not their elected representatives support a more progressive agenda.

Senate Issues—2015

1) SF 171 - 4% State Supplemental Aid for FY15

For public school aid for FY15, the Senate proposal was for a 4% increase.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 171), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES. The IFL supported 6%, but viewed 4% a better alternative than the House plan of 1.25%.***

2) SF 172 - 4% State Categorical Aid for FY15

For categorical school aid for FY15, the Senate proposal was for a 4% increase. Categorical school aid means financial support that is targeted for particular categories of students, special programs, or special purposes.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 172), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES. The IFL supported 6%, but viewed 4% a better alternative than the House plan of 1.25%.***

3) SF 174 - 4% State Supplemental Aid for FY16

For public school aid for FY16, the Senate proposal was for a 4% increase.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 174), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES. The IFL supported 6%, but viewed 4% a better alternative than the House plan of 1.25%.***

4) SF 175 - 4% State Categorical Aid for FY16

For categorical school aid for FY16, the Senate proposal was for a 4% increase. Categorical school aid means financial support that is targeted for particular categories of students, special programs, or special purposes

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 175), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES. The IFL supported 6%, but viewed 4% a better alternative than the House plan of 1.25%.***

5) SF 269 - Minimum Wage Increase

Currently Iowa's minimum wage is \$7.25/hour, which lags behind every neighboring state than ours but Wisconsin and is the lowest allowed by the federal government. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 269), the vote was: 27-22. **While the IFL supported a much higher minimum wage of at least \$10.10/hour, we believe an increase in the minimum wage is needed.***

6) SF 270 - "Wage Theft"

The problem of wage theft continues to cost Iowa workers hundreds of millions of dollars every year. This legislation would finally have held businesses accountable by holding them liable for unpaid wages, damages, and court costs as well as ensuring that workers get the proper documentation they require to know if they are being stolen from. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 270), the vote was 26-23. **The IFL Position was YES.***

7) SF 333 - Require Clarinda and Mount Pleasant MHI's to Continue to Accept Patients

This legislation would have required Clarinda and Mount Pleasant Mental Health Institutes to continue to operate and accept new patients, despite the Governor's attempts to unilaterally close the facilities. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 333), the vote was 32-18. **The IFL Position was YES.***

8) SF 402 - Prohibit the Closure of Clarinda and Mount Pleasant MHI's

This legislation would have stopped the closure of Clarinda and Mount Pleasant Mental Health Institutes, despite the Governor's attempts to close the facilities. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 402), the vote was 29-19. **The IFL Position was YES.***

9) SF 460 - Regulation on Cards as a Form of Payment from Employers

This legislation set up common sense regulations that would have made it so that employers who choose to pay their employees using debit or other cards could not take advantage of workers, nor could the banks that issue them. This would have allowed workers to withdraw their entire wages, and would have ensured that banks could not charge fees that put workers below the minimum wage. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 460), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES.***

Senate Issues—2015 *(continued)*

10) SF 437 - Time Off for Iowa Caucuses

This legislation would have allowed workers to be able to participate in the democratic process by being allowed to attend the caucuses by their employers. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 437), the vote was 26-24. **The IFL Position was YES.***

11) SF 375 - Employee Adoption Rights

This was legislation that would have allowed a individual who adopts a child the same amount of leave that is given to someone for the natural birth of a child, if that employer does offer such leave. This legislation stalled in the Iowa House.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (S.F. 375), the vote was 37-9. **The IFL Position was YES.***

12) HF 548 - Interconnection Disconnects

This legislation's purpose was to ensure that line workers and emergency personnel had a lockable, predictable place to disconnect distributed-generated electricity so they could safely do their jobs.

This legislation passed the Iowa House 100-0, was amended in the Senate, passed the Iowa House again, and was signed by the Governor.

*On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (H.F. 548), the vote was 45-0. **The IFL Position was YES.***

House Issues—2015

1) Amendment H-1002 to HF 80 - State Supplemental Aid Set at 6%

HF 80 was the House bill which would set FY15 funding for public education. House Democrats sought to amend the bill to 6%, which was the I.F.L. position.

On the question "Shall amendment H-1002 (to H.F. 80) be adopted," the vote was 43-56, and failed. The IFL position was "YES."

2) HF 80 - State Supplemental Aid Set at 1.25%

HF 80 was the House bill which would set FY15 funding for public education at 1.25%, which is far lower than inflation or the needs of Iowa's public schools.

On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (H.F. 80) the vote was 56-43. The IFL position was "NO."

3) Amendment H-1003 to HF 81 - State Categorical Aid Set at 6%

HF 81 was the House bill which would set FY15 categorical funding for public education. House Democrats sought to amend the bill to 6%, which was the IFL position.

On the question "Shall amendment H-1003 (H.F. 81) be adopted," the vote was 42-57, and failed. The IFL position was "YES."

4) HF 81 - State Categorical Aid Set at 1.25%

HF 81 was the House bill which would set FY15 categorical funding for public education at 1.25%, which is far lower than inflation or the needs of Iowa's public schools.

On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (H.F. 81) the vote was 55-44. The IFL position was "NO."

5) Amendment H-1009 to SF 171 - State Supplemental Aid Set at 1.25%

The Iowa Senate set the amount of SSA at 4%. This amendment struck the 4% figure and reduced it to 1.25%

On the question "Shall the committee amendment H-1009 to S.F. 171 be adopted, the vote was 54-45. The IFL position was "NO."

6) HF 286 - Requirement of Direct Deposit for Payment of Wages

This legislation made it a possible condition of employment that a worker must receive wages through direct deposit, and even made it impossible to get a paper check by request.

On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (H.F. 286), the vote was 57-42. The IFL position was "NO"

7) HF 397 - Child Work Hours

This legislation in this form would have allowed children to work 40 hours a week for six weeks at a time and be defined as "occasional." A different version was fixed by the Senate and eventually signed into law.

On the question "Shall the bill pass?" the vote was 55-41. The IFL position was "NO"

8) Amendment H-1093 to HF 549 - Expanding Chapter 20 Changes to all School Employees

House File 549 was the Iowa House's answer to school funding. The made argument was that the collective bargaining for teachers was making education funding unsustainable. This legislation made changes to public sector bargaining for school teachers such as comparing public school teachers to lower paid private sector equivalents, and changing the process for arbitrators to make awards to management or the bargaining unit.

This amendment expanded the bill, and made it apply to all school employees, not just teachers.

On the question "Shall amendment H-1093 (to H.F. 549) be adopted," the vote was 58-37. The IFL position was "NO."

9) HF 549 - Changes in School Employee Bargaining

House File 549 was the Iowa House's answer to school funding. Their argument was that collective bargaining for teachers was making education funding unsustainable. This legislation made changes to public sector bargaining for school teachers such as comparing public school teachers to lower paid private sector equivalents, and changing the process for arbitrators to make awards to management or the bargaining unit.

On the question "Shall the bill pass (H.F. 549), the vote was 56-41. The IFL position was "NO."

House Issues—2015 (*continued*)

10) HF 548 - Interconnection Disconnects

This legislation's main purpose was to ensure that line workers and emergency personnel had a lockable, predictable place to disconnect distributed-generated electricity so they could safely do their jobs.

This legislation passed the Iowa House, was amended in the Senate, passed the Iowa House again, and was signed by the Governor.

On the question "Shall the bill pass?" (H.F.548), the vote was 100-0. **The IFL position was "YES."**

11) Rule 60 Vote to Bring Up Minimum Wage

The Iowa House refused to bring up or even hold a subcommittee meeting on SF 269, the minimum wage bill the Iowa Senate passed.

Representative T. Taylor made a motion to bring the bill up for immediate consideration by the House so that chamber could actually take a vote on minimum wage.

On the question "Shall Senate File 269 be withdrawn from the committee on Labor and placed on the calendar, the vote was 40-56." The IFL Position was YES.

12) Amendment H-1315 to SF499 - Additional Wage Theft Investigators

For several years now the Iowa House has refused to bring up wage theft legislation. Currently Iowa only has minimal wage theft enforcers/investigators. This amendment was supposed to allocate more funds to the division for additional staff to enforce Iowa's wage laws.

On the question "Shall amendment H-1315, to the committee amendment H-1299 be adopted the vote was 42-57." The IFL Position was YES.

13) Suspend Rules for H-1326, to H-1299 to S.F. 499 - EDA Jobs Posted Online

This amendment would have required that companies that receive taxpayer dollars through Iowa Economic Development Authority would post their jobs on the state of Iowa's website. The amendment was ruled not germane, and the vote was to override the rules.

On the question "Shall the rules be suspended to consider amendment H-1326, to the committee amendment H-1299 the vote was 42-57." The IFL Position was YES.

14) Suspend the Rules to Bring Up H-1316 to H-1299 to S.F.499 - Wage Theft

This amendment would have included anti-wage wage theft legislation to SF 499, Economic Development Appropriations. The amendment was ruled not germane, and the vote was to override the rules.

On the question "Shall the rules be suspended to consider amendment H-1316, to the committee amendment H-1299. The IFL Position was YES.

15) Suspend the Rules to Bring Up H-1319 to H-1299 to S.F.499 - Pay Card Regulation

This amendment would have included anti-wage wage theft legislation to SF 499, Economic Development Appropriations. The amendment was ruled not germane, and the vote was to override the rules.

On the question "Shall the rules be suspended to consider amendment H-1316, to the committee amendment H-1299. **The IFL Position was YES.**

16) Amendment H-1359 to H-1345 to S.F. 505 - Clarinda & Mount Pleasant

This amendment was to give funding to keep the Clarinda and Mount Pleasant Mental Health Institutes open.

On the question "Shall amendment H-1359, to the committee amendment H-1345, be adopted, the vote was 41-55. **The IFL Position was YES.**

17) Suspend the Rules to Bring Up H-1376 to H-1365 to S.F. 510 - Family Paid Leave Study

This amendment to the "standings" bill would have established a study committee to look at family leave policies across the nation and develop one for Iowa. This amendment was ruled not germane, and as such the vote was to suspend the rules to allow the amendment to be voted on.

On the question "Shall the rules be suspended to consider amendment H-1376, to the committee amendment H-1365, the vote was 41-55. The IFL Position was YES.

House Issues—2015 *(continued)*

18) Suspend the Rules to Bring Up H-1375 to H-1365 to S.F. 510 – Apprenticeship Requirements for EDA Projects

This amendment to the “standings” bill would have required Economic Development Authority to ensure that contractors working on the construction side of taxpayer funded projects exceeding one million dollars would have to have a DOL approved apprenticeship program or be signatory to one.

This amendment was ruled not germane, and as such the vote was to suspend the rules to allow the amendment to be voted on.

*On the question "Shall the rules be suspended to consider amendment H-1375, to the committee amendment H-1365 the vote was 41-55. **The IFL Position was YES.***

19) HF 664 - FY16 State Supplemental Aid Set at 2%

HF 664 was the House bill which would set FY16 funding for public education at 2%, which is far lower than inflation for the needs of Iowa’s public schools, and lower than even Governor Branstad’s proposal.

On the question “Shall the bill pass the vote was 51-39. **The IFL position was “NO.”**

20) HF 665 - FY16 State Categorical Aid Set at 2%

HF 665 was the House bill which would set FY16 categorical funding for public education at 2%, which is far lower than inflation for the needs of Iowa’s public schools, and lower than even Governor Branstad’s proposal.

On the question “Shall the bill pass the vote was 51-39. **The IFL position was “NO.”**
